Parents are the
greatest teachers
of the faith!

When it comes to raising children in faith, parents matter more than any other factor. Ryan Purcell, Director of Youth Formation at the Diocese of Joliet once said, "As parents, you have the all-important task of bringing your children into relationship with Jesus and teaching them so that they come to know and love God with all their heart. Your children are constantly listening to and learning from you, and they are hard-wired to emulate mom and dad. Your children will pick up your mannerisms and

expressions; they will love who you love, learn what you teach, pray how you pray, and live by the example you model."

Faith Formation is the lifelong process of our communal journey of coming to know God. The Catholic Community of St. Jude envisions this journey as a way to grow in knowledge of our shared faith, to nurture our intimate relationship with God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and to fulfill our baptismal call as disciples of Jesus Christ. We utilize a holistic approach, in accordance with the General Directory of Catechesis, to teach what it means to **be** Catholic, to teach what one should **know** about the Catholic faith and prepare each person to **live** as a Catholic. It is through encountering Jesus that our children will recognize and follow him and this requires an intentional journey, rather than a series of tasks.

The parent/guardian and home life provide the primary source of Faith Formation for a child. The faith experience in one's home will impact one's participation in religious faith-building far more than any catechetical program. A home experience focused on knowing, loving and serving God through scripture, prayer and service is essential for establishing a hunger for lifelong, spiritual growth. St. Jude Faith Formation partners with you and offers a multi-component approach to Faith Formation that emphasizes both learning and living the faith in the home and in the community.

The Mass

Keep holy the Sabbath Day (7 reflections required for Grades 1 - 8)

All families enrolled in the St. Jude Faith Formation program are expected to participate in the Sunday Mass and in Masses for all Holy Days of Obligation. In the Catholic Mass, we gather to worship and praise God. We also receive the True Presence of God through Jesus in the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the fulfillment of God's covenant with us - His promise to be with us always. With the gift of Christ's presence in our midst, our Church is truly blessed.

Faith Formation families are encouraged to participate weekly in Catholic Mass and stay centered on the importance of the Eucharist in our lives. Families are expected to complete **seven** *Family Catholic Mass Reflections* during the Faith Formation year. The reflection is designed to help facilitate conversations before and after your family's Mass experience. *Family Catholic Mass Reflections* can be submitted online on our website.

St. Jude also offers a once-a-month Sunday evening Teen Mass that is specifically designed for youth and their families; to re-engage and empower youth to understand, embrace and live out discipleship. The Teen Mass creatively uses music, preaching and engaging extras to grab your children's attention, make them think and empower them to take action - specifically, to understand, embrace and live as present-day followers of Jesus. Teen Masses are offered at 6:30 pm on September 12th, October 10th, November 14th, December 12th (Teaching Mass), January 9th, February 13th, March 13th and April 10th.

Explore 4 – The Life of the Parish

A “living” component of our Faith Formation program (4 reflections required for Grades 1 - 8)

Children need to see us “being Church” together. We have to ask ourselves, “Do we practice the kind of church we want our children to have?” It is in the life of the parish that children truly see us being Church together. It is here that they see us living our faith.

With “Explore 4”, families are expected to participate in at least 4 St. Jude sponsored events during the course of a year. These events are opportunities to help us explore and grow in our faith and community life.

Due to current pandemic protocols, some in-person parish events may not take place this year. Modified versions of these events and new events will hopefully be added throughout the year as the Faith Formation team assesses options for safe in-person Explore 4 events. We are able to host virtual events and most in-person events are livestreamed. Participation in a St. Jude or Diocese of Joliet sponsored virtual event can count toward your Explore 4 expectation.

To help families complete the Explore 4 expectation during this time of limited parish events, we have developed Explore 4 At Home. Explore 4 At Home gives families the opportunity to choose and complete their own faith-based activities completely at home. Doing faith-based activities at home (outside of a virtual Mass or completing Faith Formation assignments) can count toward your Explore 4 expectation. We have a growing list of suggested activities on our website. This is not an all-encompassing list. If your family does something not on our list that is helping you to continue to grow in faith at home, reflect on this activity and write about your experience.

An Explore 4 Reflection form is available online for your family to use as you reflect on your experience. Families should submit reflections for 4 *different* events or Explore 4 At Home activities. Any event that happens at St. Jude that is not Mass or the Sacrament of Reconciliation is an Explore 4 opportunity. Sacramental preparation does count toward the Explore 4 expectation.

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Preparation for the Reception of Sacraments

There is a two year preparation period for the reception of Sacraments in the Diocese of Joliet as mandated by the Office of the Bishop. This preparation is in addition to attendance in regular and ongoing Faith Formation. If a child comes from another faith formation/religious education program or a Catholic school, they still will be expected to go through our sacramental preparation sessions. Exceptions may be made if the director/principal of their former program provides us with written testimony to the fact that the youth has received preparation under their direction and in accordance with the Diocese of Joliet or their home diocese.

First Reconciliation and First Eucharist

First Reconciliation and First Eucharist are typically received in 2nd grade or in a child's second consecutive year of Faith Formation. Generally children in the second grade are considered as having reached the age of reason, and thus ready to receive First Reconciliation and First Eucharist. In these younger grades, children receive two years of religious instruction with additional preparation for the Sacraments in the second year (second grade). If a child arrives in the second grade, this will be their first year of instruction and sacramental preparation will begin in the third grade. If a child arrives after this time, a similar process will be followed and the child will be placed in their grade-level classroom. Preparation for First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in our parish takes the form of family instruction outside of the regular monthly faith formation sessions. This is a faith journey for the whole family as we renew our understanding of and commitment to the gifts of grace we receive in the Sacraments. **F o l l o w i n g** all family sacramental preparation sessions, activity materials will be sent home with the families to help parents continue sacramental preparation at home.

There will be a preparation session for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Children will then have the opportunity to receive the sacrament in the weeks that follow this session. There will be a family retreat and family practice for First Eucharist. We also have home preparation options available to families who would prefer to prepare at home. Sacramental preparation does count toward the family Explore 4 expectation if a reflection is completed. The dates for the reception of the Sacraments will be assigned. See page 6 for tentative dates.

Students often begin in our program in the older grades and are in need of First Reconciliation/First Eucharist. Each of these situations will be handled in a pastoral manner; students and parents will meet with a Faith Formation team leader over the period of two years outside of the regular instructional sessions. Each case will be considered on an individual basis, but **two years of formal instruction and preparation is the *minimum***. Students who have missed years of Faith Formation may be required to make up that formation.

Confirmation

Students who express a desire to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation may do so after two consecutive years of participation in Junior High Youth Ministry Faith Formation (completing the theme of the month discussions with parents and meeting regularly with their mentor and small group). The earliest that St. Jude will Confirm a student is at the end of 8th grade; however, students in high school are welcome to participate in the preparation sessions when they are ready to do so. Sacramental preparation takes the form of three Catholic Skills Workshops in the first year (Scripture Skills, Teaching Mass and Christian Prayer) and three Confirmation prep sessions in the second year, and a retreat each year. The workshops and prep sessions are intended for both youth and a parent or sponsor to attend and count toward the Explore 4 expectation. Teens are expected to write a report on their chosen patron saint, choose a sponsor and write a letter to our pastor requesting permission to be Confirmed.

Baptism

If your child has not been baptized or was baptized in another faith and is over the age of 7, please contact the Director of Lifelong Faith Formation regarding special preparation for your child.

If an adult desires to receive the Sacraments or wishes to become Catholic, please call the Director of Lifelong Faith Formation.

In-Person Faith Formation Event Safety Information

All in-person Faith Formation events are in compliance with the safety protocols outlined by the Illinois Department of Public Health, the CDC, DCFS and the Diocese of Joliet.

Families Living Faith (In-Person Learning for Grades 1 - 6)

In our Families Living Faith (FLF) program, children come together at St. Jude for an hour and a half session approximately once per month. In these sessions, students are introduced to a new unit of study by catechists in age-appropriate classrooms. Parents are provided with resources to teach the next two chapters of each unit at home. Children then complete the unit review before their next session to assure that teaching occurred at home.



Families sign up for a specific session and attend that session throughout the year (see page 6 for dates). Registrations will be accepted in the order they are received. Availability at each FLF session is limited due to space. Please register ASAP to receive first choice in schedule. We will make every effort to honor your request.

Families Called to Table (Home Learning for Grades 1 - 6)

Families Called to Table (FCT) is a completely homeschool Faith Formation program. Families receive curriculum support, including children's workbooks and scripted parent lesson plans. To assist parents in leading their child's faith formation completely at home, grade-level video lessons will be available that teach the first chapter of each unit. Parents are then expected to use the resources provided to teach the next two chapters of each unit at home and complete a unit review with their child to assure that teaching occurs at home.

Families in Families Living Faith and Families Called to Table are also expected to complete and turn in four or more **Explore 4** reflection forms each year (see page 3) and monthly **F a m i l y Catholic Mass** reflections (see page 2).

Through monthly parent sessions, offered in person and over livestream, we will explore Scripture and Catholic Teaching at an adult level while also coaching parents on how to teach these concepts at home. Parents are the primary faith teachers of their children and we support you in this call. In these parent sessions, we delve into the themes and concepts the children will be learning in engaging and impactful ways through speakers, prayer experiences and faith sharing. Our faith journey is lifelong and never ends. See page 6 for dates.

[Junior High Youth Ministry \(Grades 7 - 8\) & High School Youth Ministry \(Grades 9 - 12\)](#)



St. Jude Youth Ministry aims to inspire, empower and transform junior high and high school teens and their families to help them to grow in knowledge of their faith and create habits in faith practices of gratitude, prayer and Sacraments. Students and families have access to the LIFElong+ app (available as a free download for all smart phones, tablets and computers, scan the QR code to the right for access). The app allows students and parents to easily access high-quality evangelizing and catechizing content (videos, articles, links to Mass and prayer experiences, etc.). The app also allows students to submit Mass and stewardship reflections as well as their feedback and questions about the videos or articles.

Students will also belong to a small group that meets regularly either face-to-face or virtually on a Sunday or Monday (see page 8 for dates). Mentors will be trained and massively supported by Faith Formation staff. Teen participants are expected to view and read the posted videos or articles on the app each month, discuss the theme with family, submit a brief reflection on the app and develop faith habits of Scripture, Sacraments and service (simple reflection forms for Mass and service will be available to help students track their progress and understanding). Youth Ministry will also offer stewardship events for teens and families - strictly following the Diocesan guidelines for health and safety. Teens are encouraged to attend a monthly Teen Mass with their small groups and families. This very engaging liturgy will inspire and empower your whole family to embrace and live as present-day followers (disciples) of Jesus.

Year One teens, typically 7th graders, are required to attend the three Catholic Skills Workshops (Scripture Skills, Teaching Mass and Christian Prayer) and Year Two teens, typically 8th graders, must attend three Confirmation Prep Sessions. Parents are asked to accompany their teens at all of those sessions - attendance counts for Explore 4. Both 7th and 8th grade teens are also expected to attend one retreat each year, participate in a variety of service projects and complete one Stewardship Log with a Stewardship Reflection. Families are also expected to complete and turn in four or more Explore 4 (see page 3) reflections each year and turn in seven Family Catholic Mass Reflections (see page 2).
